About Us

Canadian Parents for French is a nationwide. research-informed, volunteer organization that represents 25,000 members across Canada and champions the opportunity to learn and use French for all those who call Canada home.

Canadian Parents for French was founded in 1977 by parents who wanted to ensure that children would have the opportunity to become bilingual in the Canadian school system.

Originally a small group of concerned parents who met in Ottawa. Canadian Parents for French has evolved into a proactive National Network with 12 Branches and offices and over 140 Chapters in communities nationwide.

The work of Canadian Parents for French is structured around four pillars that represent the stakeholders involved in our work.

Highlights

> Teach in French - Enseigne en français

This initiative was developed to assist in addressing the challenges relating to teacher supply. Eight (8) bilingual interactive presentations with videos were created to inspire youth to seriously consider careers teaching French and teaching in French. Promotional campaigns used the mediums of billboards, benches and city transit to share messaging with the general public. City/rural billboards and transit advertising had an estimated 8,306,712 viewings, and benches at bus stops/stations had an estimated 22,415,478 viewings!

> Concours d'art oratoire

New categories were fully implemented, giving more diverse options for FSL and FFL students to showcase their French language skills. For example, the new *Une conversation imaginaire (Duo)* category had a record number of participants. The popularity of such categories contributed to making this a record breaking vear, with 6,786 students participating at the school/school divisions levels of competition and 157 participants at the provincial level of competition!

> French for Life & French: An Opportunity of a Lifetime!

CPF-MB continued to enhance recruitment, and decrease attrition in FSL programs throughout the province. The high demand for in-class promotional presentations continued. Forty (40) schools were visited and 83 presentations delivered. Students learned about the benefits of continuing their French studies and official bilingualism. They were also provided with information about FSL opportunities, careers, cultural exchanges, scholarships and bursaries. Website and social media facets improved in popularity, e.g. 5,454 website users – an increase of 93% compared to the previous year, and 1,139 Facebook likes - an increase of 19% compared to the previous year!

of Winnipeg, where access to French sociocultural activities continue to be limited.

Students performed skits using props and costume pieces, and instantaneously improvised advertisements, movie trailers and speeches.

Due Diligence

PF-MB met its administrative, financial, legal and governance obligations. Required reports were submitted on time to funders, the CPF-MB Board and to CPF National.

The CPF-MB Board of Directors reviewed the current (2017-2020) organizational strategic plan at its meetings, to ascertain that current Branch operational and governance activities continued to complement the said plan.

The Funding Summary provided to the Board Directors gave an oversight of funding awarded from various sources from 2003 to the present. Furthermore, the Funding Diagram provided a visual of funding sources and uses. Both documents were particularly useful to new Board Directors.

Leadership

he CPF-MB President took a leadership role in the Council of Presidents (CoP) group and encouraged her peers to be proactive in the governance of their Branches. Consequently, attendance at CoP meetings increased. The President also continued to contribute at all CPF National Bylaw Committee meetings.



Wrap-up of Strategic Plan 2015-2020

One main area of growth

During the period covered by this plan, the rate of French Immersion enrollment in Manitoba reached an all time high of over 26,000 students. This reflected an increased confidence in parents with regards to choosing FSL options for their children. However, in some cases this demand exacerbated existing challenges related to teacher supply and retention. CPF-MB reacted to this situation by seeking and acquiring support from Manitoba Education to develop an initiative that would assist in addressing this issue. The result was Teach in French – Enseigne en français. Looking ahead, this project will serve to affect and influence students at an early and receptive age. It will encourage them to consider the careers of teaching in French and teaching French. It is anticipated that this will lead to students being more motivated to build on their French skills. Consequently, it is anticipated that more individuals will choose teaching in French and teaching French as careers and this will positively effect the issue of teacher supply.
