Canadian Parents for French is a nationwide, research-informed, volunteer organization that represents members across Canada and champions the opportunity to learn and use French for all those who call Canada home.

Canadian Parents for French was founded in 1977 by parents who wanted to ensure that children would have the opportunity to become bilingual in the Canadian school system.

Originally a small group of concerned parents who met in Ottawa. Canadian Parents for French has evolved into a proactive National Network with 11 Branches and offices and over 140 Chapters in communities nationwide.

In 2020-2021, in light of the worldwide pandemic, Canadian Parents for French worked together as a national network to lead initiatives in support of Canadian parents and FSL learners, shifting our focus to virtual programming and sharing resources beyond geographical barriers

ue to COVID-19 and related closures of schools. many classroom, school and divisional levels of this prominent French speaking competition did not go ahead. Furthermore, the provincial finals also had to be cancelled due to government safety restrictions. However, at very short notice the CPF Network determined a nationwide alternate activity "Concours Virtuel". Manitoba students joined others from across the country and submitted videos of themselves speaking in French about the experience of COVID-19. They shared how the pandemic was impacting their everyday lives and their schooling. Congratulations to the 66 cash prize winners from grade 6 to 12 in French (English program), French immersion and Francophone categories, sharing in prizes totalling more than \$10,000. Additionally, almost \$13,000 has been committed to Food Banks Canada as a donation on behalf of entries of K-grade 5 students.

The alternate Concours was successful in achieving its educational objectives and regardless of unprecedented circumstances, it provided language opportunities that assisted FSL and FFL students to:

- improve, develop confidence and enhance pride in their French language abilities;
- demonstrate their French language skills to peers, parents/family members;
- share their experiences of a unique situation in 21st century history (a pandemic), with fellow Francophiles and Francophones, and thus nurtured a commonality and spirit of unification.

French Cultural Tours

The tours were fully booked and scheduled to take place in the fall of 2020. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and related restricted access to schools, these had to be rescheduled. However, Rob Malo, French cultural entertainer, made adaptations and live streamed sessions, which participating schools were able to access.

Through Rob's character of TiBert le Voyageur and an imaginary bison hunt, students worked in groups to explore the process of developing an oral story and created a visual storyboard to produce short stories and plays.






Mom's Pantry Fundraiser - raised funds to provide resources for FI classrooms.

CPF ADVOCACY IN ACTION I

Report of the Commissioner of Official Languages

In September 2020, the Report of the Commissioner of Official Languages was shared. It provided pertinent reminders to CPF-MB and other stakeholders that the federal government has the responsibility to ensure:

- a meaningful modernization of the Official Languages Act (OLA);
- that Canadians can exercise their fundamental rights in the official language of their choice:
- the promotion of the importance of Canada's official languages among both official languages majority groups.

The Commissioner's report also included information that can be used for advocacy purposes e.g., popularity of FSL programs, French Immersion growth and its link to teacher supply challenges. Furthermore, readers could see mention of the CPF-MB project Teach in French/Enseigne en français, and CPF-sourced quotes from youth about linguistic security.

In March, the government of Canada document French and English: towards a substantive equality for official languages in Canada was shared. It gave insight into proposed changes to the Official Languages Act (OLA). Comments from CPF-MB and like-minded organizations about the modernization of the Act had been taken into account. The included proposed concrete actions (if approved) will help guide CPF-MB to promote a better understanding of linguistic duality and the importance of access to official language learning.

The advocacy event was scheduled to take place in conjunction with the 2021 CPF-MB AGM. Due to the uncertainty re: COVID-19 related restrictions, it was postponed. It will be held before March 31, 2022. At that time elected and non-elected officials and stakeholders will be encouraged to attend/speak/deliver messages. Additionally, CPF-MB Chapters will be provided with opportunities to share provincial and local/community-level success stories and challenges.

Executive Director's Message



This past year has been challenging for everyone. CPF-MB experienced a significant change in staffing. Two key employees, who possessed substantial knowledge and expertise, left the organization during this reporting year.

I assumed the role of Executive Director on February 1, 2021, and although faced with the challenge of being short-staffed, I embraced my new role. I remain passionate about what we do as an organization, all that it stands for and I am honored to have the opportunity to be part of the future of CPF-MB.

- Create and promote opportunities for YOUTH to learn and use French as an official language.
- Support a collaborative Network of PARENTS, MEMBERS, AND VOLUNTEERS.
- Inform and influence DECISION MAKERS on the value of official language bilingualism.
- Work together as an ORGANIZATION to continue building a dynamic, strong, and effective Pan-Canadian Network.

Although many in-person activities were not possible, CPF-MB was still able to effectively focus on Network priorities. The Branch adapted its programming and activities where possible, which enabled the virtual delivery of initiatives. Many chapters also incorporated this same process and were successful in furthering the goals of CPF at the grassroots level.

I would like to thank our chapter volunteers who continue to promote the benefits of bilingualism in their communities. These volunteers remain dedicated to the goals of CPF and have worked tirelessly in their efforts.
